Completion of BidEnergy Acquisition

On 1 July 2016, immediately following the end of the quarter, the Company completed its acquisition of cloud-based energy spend management platform provider, BidEnergy Pty Ltd.

The Company has been renamed BidEnergy Limited and is currently finalising the recompliance process in order to relist on the Australian Securities Exchange (ASX). The Company expects to recommence trading on the ASX under the new ticker code 'BID' shortly.

Divestment of Exploration Projects

As required under the terms of the acquisition of BidEnergy, the Company has now completed the divestment of its existing resource assets.
